

OPERATOR

CFOs deliver efficient finance operations including Procurement, Accounts Payable, Cash and Revenue Management, Property Tax, Payroll among other financial transactions.



STEWARD

CFOs safeguard municipal assets, ensure Council and management are well-informed through budget development, analysis, regular financial reporting, audits and compliance with legislation.



STRATEGIST

CFOs are key contributors to strategic planning and the municipality's future direction including community engagement. Developing innovative financing and investment strategies to support long-term plans are critical for financial stability.



CATALYST

CFOs drive change and process improvements through business partnerships, cost reduction strategies, innovative procurement and service delivery approaches. Managing risk and leveraging technology drive results and opportunities.




